To Speak Her Heart is an exhibition of prints, mixed media and lithographs, and culminates 10 years of research conducted by the artists on the development and use of Jewish women's devotional prayers. The exhibition reveals rare existing examples of women's prayers and poems that provide a glimpse into the history of women's lives.

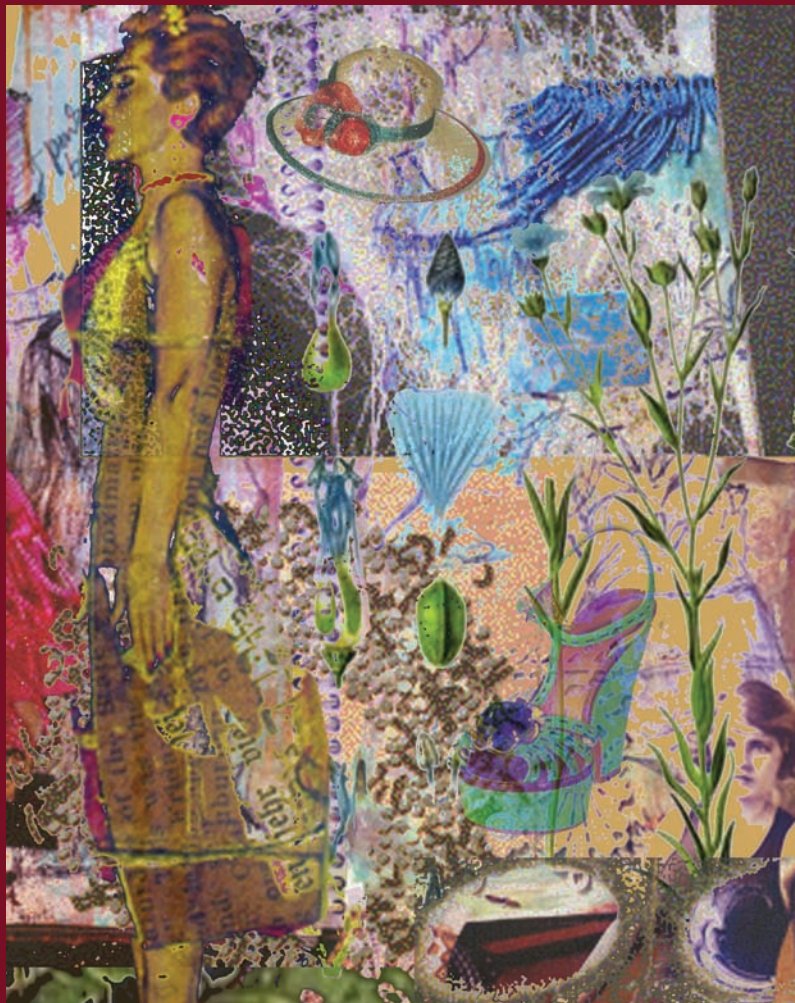
